Fly-In Acres Lake Rules

(Please follow these rules for your safety)

Members must be in possession of their Fly-In lake card in order to use the facilities. Lake cards, along with photo ID, must be shown upon request.

Use of Fly-In Acres Lake is a privilege and management has the right to deny access due to inappropriate behavior. Profanity is not tolerated and is grounds for immediate ejection from the lake.

The California State Health and Safety Code requires that an adult at least 18 years old must accompany children unable to swim and children under 14 yrs.

Parents are responsible for the behavior and safety of their children at all times (even when there is lake personnel on duty).

Glass containers of any kind are not allowed on any of the beach area. It is mandatory that infants and children who are not completely potty trained wear tight fitting swim pants in the lake.

When lake attendants are on duty, they will enforce the rules and take any action necessary to ensure the enjoyment and safety of members and guests.

All musical devices must be used with ear buds. Cooperation is mandatory.

Use of fireworks of any kind is not permitted.

No animals are allowed in lake areas: except authorized ADA dogs.

Bicycles, skates, roller-blades, skateboards, or scooters are not permitted on any of the Fly-In Lake property. Equipment may be confiscated if used.

Loitering in the parking lot is not permitted.

Possession of alcoholic beverages by persons less than 21 years is prohibited.

Tobacco products are not to be use by anyone under 18 years. Also, possession or use of illegal substances is not allowed or tolerated.

For your safety, we ask you to set up your tents or umbrellas 20 feet back from the waters edge.

Pushing and shoving is not allowed on any of the docks.

No rock throwing.

Rafts and other large floating devices are not allowed in the roped off or shallow areas of the lake.

Fires and BBQ's are not permitted on the beaches.

Notice: Members and guests using any of the Blue Lake Springs facilities do so at their own risk. Neither the Blue Lake Springs Association or Fly-In Acres Association, not its management is responsible for injuries or accidents.
